"Hi, my name is Rob, and I am the newest member of the Family Support Team at Salisbury hospice. We support people, and their families, known to the hospice who are facing terminal illness. Our work continues into bereavement and we are very lucky to have an excellent

and skilled contingent of Bereavement Support Volunteers who work alongside us to provide support to those who need it. While previously on a temporary contract my position became permanent in October following the retirement of Jane Daniel after over 30 years of service. Jane has been not only a fundamental member of the team but an exceptional person and professional who will be greatly missed.

"Loss does not just relate to the death of a person. The times of the pandemic have certainly highlighted this to us. Losses such as interactions with friends and family, wider support structures, and familiar rituals have affected us all but have had a particular impact on those experiencing death and dying. For those facing bereavement it has made things a lot harder and a lot lonelier.

"We hope to bring back a shared sense of loss and remembrance at our forthcoming Light Up a Life service, an event where we can come together, reflect and remember."

A Memorable Finish

This August over 80 kind supporters from all over the country participated in our 40 Memory Miles Challenge.

This year as we celebrate 40 years of providing outstanding end of life care to patients, we asked supporters to get moving and complete 40 Miles. Our walkers combined have managed to complete an outstanding 3,500 miles and have raised £19,500 for Salisbury Hospice Charity!

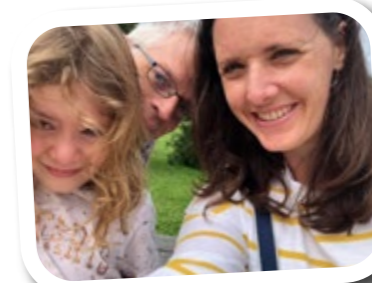
The idea of the challenge was to encourage participants to explore the great outdoors, get fit, and take time to remember treasured moments of lost loved ones, whilst raising money for Salisbury Hospice.



Participants included Ann Currie (86), who walked 70 miles in loving memory of her husband and raised over £2,500 for the hospice and Brian Allen (82), who walked 82 miles in Spain – one mile for every birthday!

Long-time supporter Steve Smith, had this to say about the challenge, "After missing the last two Midnight Walks it was great to have an opportunity to both remember my wife Heather, and the excellent care she was given by the Hospice, and to raise both funds and awareness for this amazing charity. 40 miles didn't seem far enough, so I trebled that and achieved it with a day to spare."

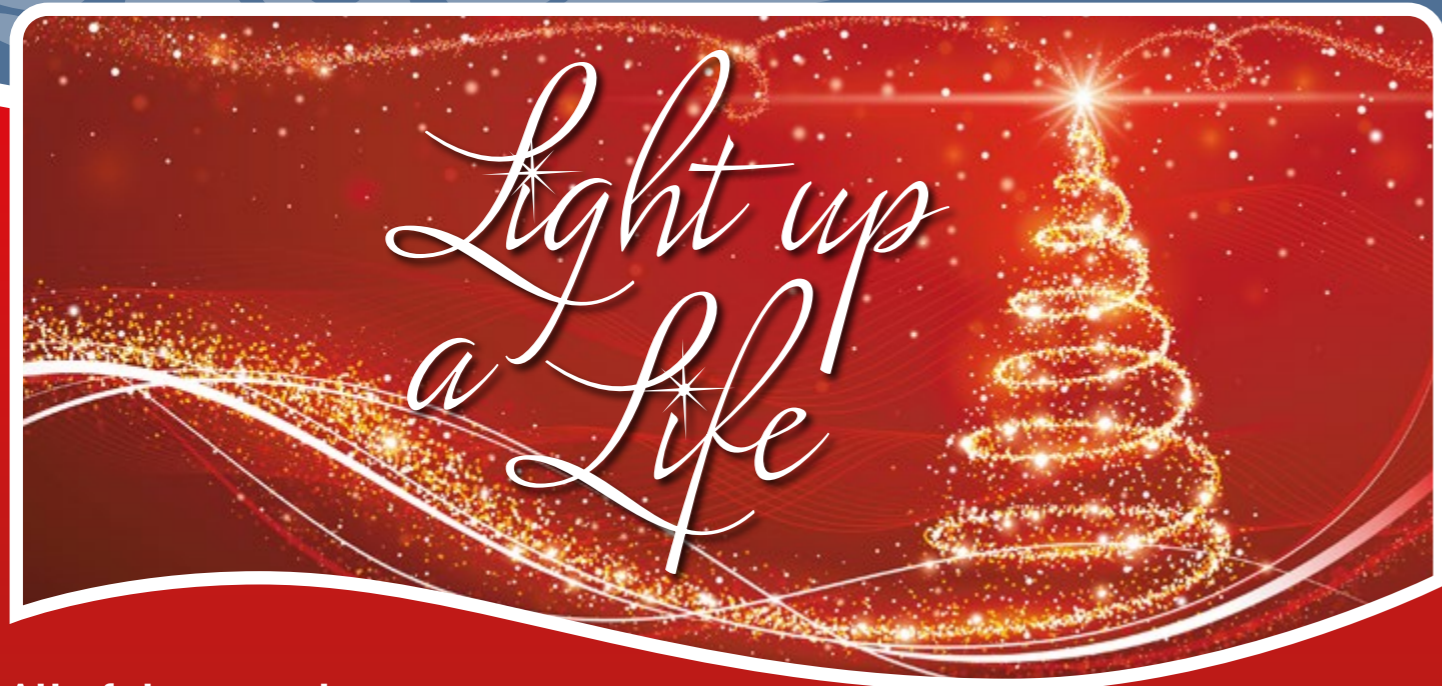

Remembering loved ones at Christmas



Christmas can be a hard time of the year when you have lost a loved one, whether it's a year or 30 years on, we all wish to spend our Christmas with the ones we love most.

At this time of year, we often reflect and recall fond memories of Christmas's past. It's a great time to celebrate the life of those who have passed and are dearly missed.

Michelle Read kindly shares below her story of Christmas with her mum and their experience of the hospice. after school to keep her company until Graham returned from work.

During November time, mum started to visit the hospice and go to the Peter Gillam Centre, which she loved. Mum was a very outgoing lady, so made friends with everyone there. The volunteers would

collect her from home and take her to the centre once a week. She made so many items, which we still have at home. Arts, crafts and mediation were just a few of my mum's favourite activities to take part in.

After a fall in January 2019, mum was admitted to Salisbury Hospice which is where she spent her last 6 weeks. I cannot express how the staff and volunteers made mum and our family feel whilst there. We were due to go to Disneyland Paris but for obvious reasons we weren't able to go, so instead, Disneyland Paris came to the hospice. Balloons, pictures, Mickey Mouse cake, games and Disney music was played - even the nurses came and joined in wearing Mickey and Minnie ears and face masks. Such wonderful memories.

My step-dad and I stayed at the hospice many times over the 6 weeks and never did we feel like we were not welcome. When the day came, that mum sadly fell to sleep, the support of the team was incredible. I never knew about Salisbury Hospice before and I must admit, felt very scared when we were told mum would be staying. But, I can honestly say that mum had the best end of life care possible and I am truly grateful to everyone who looked after her.

Just over 2 years on, I am still raising much-needed funds for Salisbury Hospice and the total at present is just over £20,000! I have managed this with many events and the help of some very special friends. Some successful events have been an online Auction, Clothes Sale, the Hospice's Walk 40 Miles for 40 years. Next year, my husband and I are taking on the Mont Blanc Trek which we are very excited to do. I will carry on fundraising for the hospice forever."

"Christmas to mum was all about family and love. A time to smile at the silly gifts exchanged, the laughter of playing games and generally having the best time with the family. This is something that I will cherish and continue to do with my husband and children. Our last Christmas together was with the people she loved and we made it an extremely special time. We even managed to take her ice skating in her wheelchair just after Christmas - her face was a picture."

In 2017, my mum (Sally Sheppard) was diagnosed with Lung Cancer. After intensive chemo and radiology, mum was told she was in remission in January 2018. To celebrate, mum and I treated ourselves to a fantastic week in Holland, sightseeing and thoroughly enjoying ourselves without a care in the world.

It was in July 2018, when mum started to feel poorly again and after more scans, she was then advised that she had secondary cancer - in fact, 5 brain tumours, that would not be able to be operated on or treated.

It was then, that mum had to give up work, she had worked all the way through otherwise. I was lucky enough to be able to take Fridays off work to spend more time with mum and help her with the day to day chores whilst my step-dad worked. On the other days, myself and Ollie (son), would pop in and give my mum her breakfast during the week, pop in at lunchtime to help her to the toilet and make her lunch, then again

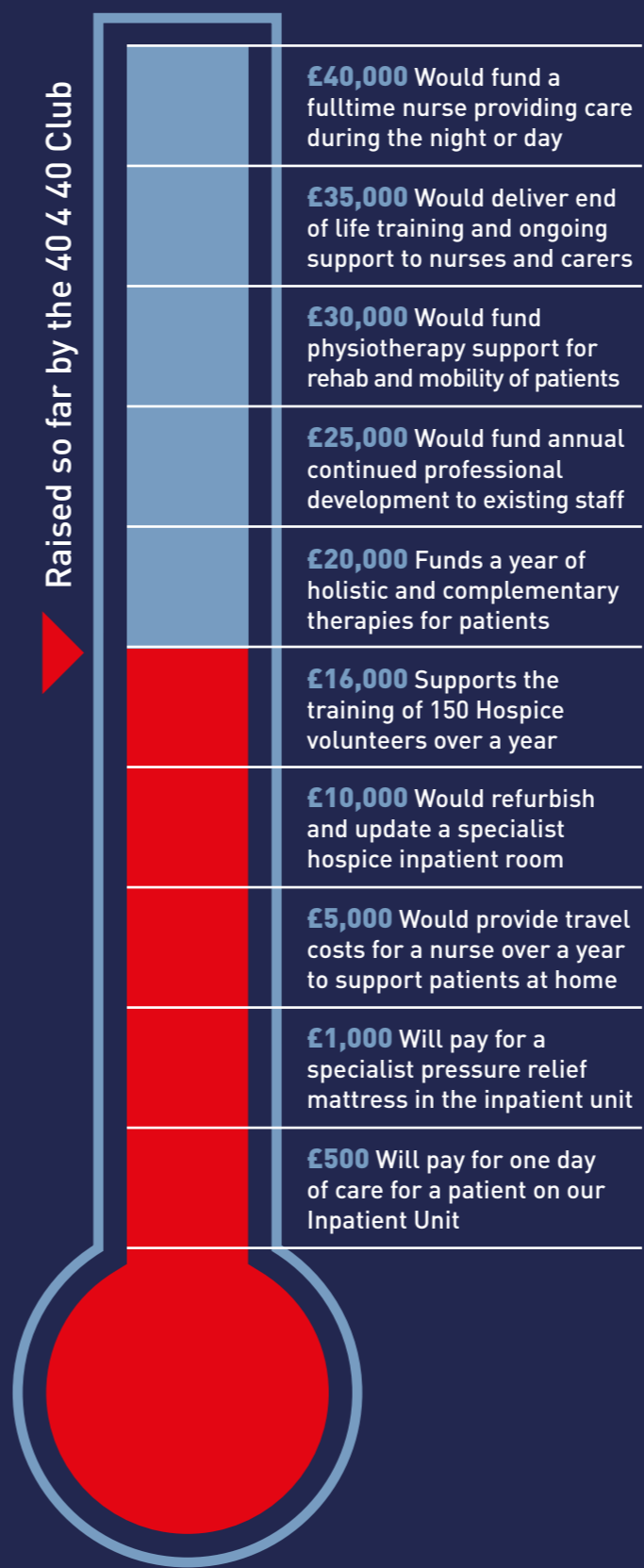

£500 will pay to train a specialist Hospice at Home carer

Run DMB's South Coast Challenge

Team Run DMB have gone above and beyond in their fundraising efforts and have raised a jaw-dropping £17,527 for Salisbury Hospice!



Run DMB are a team of family and friends of the late Darren Mark Beale, who tragically lost his life to leukemia on the 8th of April 2019 at just 33 years

of age. Darren was a much-loved son, brother, nephew, cousin and good friend to all participating.

Their fundraising began with a plan to take on The Jurassic Coast Challenge in May 2020 but due to several postponements caused by the recent pandemic, they sadly could not take part. This resilient bunch were however not deterred and were determined to complete a challenge. They kept up their training, including walking in some extreme weather conditions and decided that they would take on the South Coast Challenge in September of this year.

The challenge was a gruelling 100km trek over two days, in incredibly warm conditions across the South Downs Way, from Eastbourne to Arundel. Upon finishing the trek, the group was met with overwhelming



emotion for what has been an epic and hugely challenging journey in memory of Darren. They had the following to say about the challenge:

"It was harder than we ever imagined it would be – some huge and seemingly endless hills, km after km of craggy flint paths jabbing away at the soles of your feet, blisters on top of blisters, cramp, muscle strains, a severe lack of sleep for most of us, probably a bit of heatstroke thrown in for good measure.

It wasn't pretty or glamorous, but we made it to the end after around 19 hours of hiking. It was emotional, it was exhausting and it was physically the hardest thing any of us have ever done. Keeping going mentally was possibly the bigger challenge – trying to stay positive and continue through the pain to get to the end.

But most of all it was incredibly rewarding and an achievement we can always look back on with immense pride.

We took on this challenge in memory of Darren Mark Beale – a beloved son, brother, cousin, nephew and great friend. We love him, we miss him and we hope we did him proud."



Darren's Story

Darren was first diagnosed in September 2017, his life changed forever from that day on. He spent months in hospital with many sessions of chemo and radiotherapy followed by a stem cell transplant. In September 2018

the leukemia returned and he was told he had just months to live. Darren chose to stay at home where his family could care for him and his friends could visit. The disease gradually wore him down and when caring became difficult the Hospice at Home team stepped in.

"Without the Hospice at Home service, it would have been impossible for Darren to remain at home. They gave invaluable care and support night and day. The Hospice continues to support the family, we cannot praise them highly enough."

We couldn't be prouder of this fabulous team of fundraisers, they have gone above and beyond in their commitment and efforts to so kindly support Salisbury Hospice. The funds raised will support other families going through incredibly difficult times, ensuring they can receive the care and support of the hospice when it's needed most. From all the team here we think you are incredible, thank you!

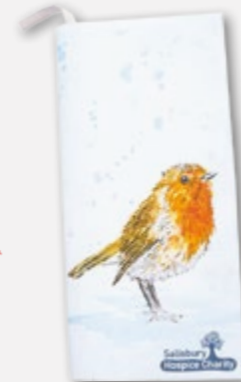
