Rhonda begins "I joined the hospice team at the start of the new year, as an Education Lead. This exciting new role is one which is fully-funded by the Salisbury Hospice Charity.

I feel privileged to step into this new position where I will be responsible for creating and implementing an educational program to support the learning and development of our specialist palliative care teams. In time, this program will also benefit our volunteers, patients, carers and external community partners.

My background is nursing, having worked as a clinical nurse specialist for several years in urology-oncology and palliative care. I began my years in Salisbury at Salisbury District Hospital's spinal injury unit.

Throughout my career, I have predominantly worked within the NHS, however, I have also gained valuable experience in the private and charity sectors, both in London and beyond. It's wonderful to be able to be a part of the Salisbury Hospice team, and to work alongside such dedicated, highly-skilled colleagues.

Meeting the charity team, who work together to raise £1.5 of the £2.9 million needed to run the hospice each year, was truly inspiring, to see their hard work come to fruition. With a plethora of fantastic and exhilarating fundraising events we are in for an exciting year."

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Free Will Scheme



We have partnered with Parker Bullen in Salisbury who are waiving their normal will writing fee for the preparation of a basic or standard will. All we ask for in return is a donation to Salisbury Hospice Charity.

Parker Bullen's, Kirsty Gazzard shared with us that, "According to a recent survey conducted by Canada Life and reported in the Financial Times, 57% of people in the UK do not have a will, with 33% of those being over the age of 55. The main reason behind this was that people do not believe they have enough wealth or assets to warrant making a will, which is a concerning statement as a will is an important document for anyone, not purely those with a large estate.

Writing a will has so many benefits aside from allowing you to distribute your estate according to your wishes, such as being able to name guardians for your children, making appropriate provisions for tax planning on your estate as well as being able to name who you may not want to inherit. We live in a society where family arrangements can be complex; if you have been married before, have children from a previous relationship or you are cohabiting with your partner, your estate may not be distributed as you intend under the laws of intestacy (passing away without a will). We also live in an increasingly digital world and writing a will can be a useful way to make provisions for our digital assets, such as our online banking, social media accounts and online shopping.

In addition, the survey discovered that 12% of respondents stated that they had no intention of making a will in the future, with other reasons including thinking that they have enough time to make a will, not knowing what to do with their assets or estate and not understanding the process of making a will. This is why we take great pride in joining forces with Salisbury Hospice as part of their will writing scheme. We understand that this will be a daunting prospect and so we strive to make the process as accessible, thorough and stress-free as possible. By working with an excellent charity such as Salisbury Hospice, you can have the peace of mind of knowing that your family will be looked after in the future while supporting a wonderful local cause.

This year sees the 10th anniversary of the Fabulous Family Fun Day. This popular family event is a regular date in so many people's diaries. The free event, which started from very humble beginnings, now boasts a football and a rugby tournament, a beer festival, pimms and prosecco bars, a live music festival stage and, for the first time this year, a performance arena. There is something for the whole family including a grand raffle, children's entertainment with Circus Wessex, two bouncy slides and DJ Kev, a petanque tournament, street food and much more.

Greig started the event in 2013 after his wife Lyn, who was cared for so well by Salisbury Hospice, died - leaving Greig with three young sons to look after. "I wanted to give back after Lyn and our family were given such outstanding, phenomenal care - the nurses went above and beyond to ensure we were



all coping in the best way we could". That first year he raised **£668** with the help of his family and friends. Every year since, Greig has grown the event, with the help of his fabulous committee of Spencer, Sarah, Sam, Claire, Jason and Tamsin. This incredible committee have raised an extraordinary **£100,000** to date for Salisbury Hospice, with last year's event raising in excess of **£26,000**. Greig was also awarded the "Charity Fundraiser of the Year" award in the Spire local hero awards of 2020.

Remembering Jeremy Saye

Jeremy Saye was an outstanding hospice volunteer and when he died earlier this year we lost a great friend and supporter.

Jeremy's support stretches back 20 years, when he became the Treasurer of our wonderful Tisbury Fundraising Committee in April 2004. He was a very active member of the committee, not only keeping an eye on all things "financial" but also being very "hands on", along with his wife Carol, at the numerous fundraising events organised by the committee over the past two decades.

Jeremy was inspired to support Salisbury Hospice after he and Carol ran Albany House Residential Home and saw how the hospice supported both patients and their families, with their dedicated end of life care and bereavement services.

Jeremy's careful stewardship of the funds raised at events, together

with the collection boxes located in businesses throughout the Tisbury area, resulted in the remarkable sum of **£379,880** being raised for Salisbury Hospice from April 2004 to date, by the Tisbury Fundraising Committee.

Jeremy was so much more than a volunteer. He was one of life's great characters and a friend to us all. Someone who was always willing to roll up his sleeves whilst providing a witty observation on life and fundraising.

Quite simply, he was an extraordinary supporter of the hospice. We will miss him so much, not only for his incredible support over many years, but also for his many visits to the charity office where his wit and straight talking were greatly appreciated.



Open Garden Saturday 31st August From 11:00am Hatch House

Bereavement Support



Our Bereavement Support service enables people to talk through their experience of grief in a safe space, either individually or as a group. There is no time limit to access this service. Over the next 12 months, we will continue to offer support to at least 500 people. Bereavement Support is offered to all whose loved ones have been under the care of Salisbury Hospice.

Six years ago, Caroline Black, Senior Social Worker of the Family Support Team started a bereavement group. The aim of the group was to offer regular support to those experiencing grief.

In September, the bereavement group members attended Salisbury Hospice to celebrate their sixth anniversary of coming together. What started as bereavement counselling, quickly turned into a lifetime of friendship and a plethora of shared experiences. The attendees, who have been friends for many years now, would like to share the success of how they have benefited from bereavement support and how their remarkable friendship has evolved over the years.

Shirley said the following:

"The group has helped me and everyone here to engage with life, as life is full of possibilities. We have all helped each other, through the process and have grown to be such good friends.

Although the bereavement counselling has long finished, we take comfort in each other and arrange days out as a group.

The majority of us have dogs and love to walk, so we meet at one location and walk to a local café or pub for a lunchtime meal."

Jude, joined in to say:

"I am proud I chose to attend the bereavement sessions, as I have come so far. Although the first meeting was difficult, I now have a full understanding of grief and made new friends at the same time, who are also travelling along the same path. Also, being part of the group, I have learnt many practical things for living alone.

I know the rural areas of Salisbury quite well and enjoy scouting new locations for our walks. Recently we have enjoyed a few visits to the New Forest."

Marie said the following:

"The group sessions, have enabled me to meet with other people in the same boat and gain an understanding that there is no timescale to grief. Being part of the group, has allowed me to have a new sense of friendship, which is very uplifting and takes away the feeling of isolation.

We even meet for Christmas parties and a few of us meet for Sunday lunch occasionally. It is lovely to have such a wonderful group of friends, who are travelling in the same boat as you. I was really glad I attended the group sessions and can't thank Caroline enough.
