Because of your time, energy, and enthusiasm, 321 walkers took part in our annual Midnight Walk, helping to raise an incredible £42,000 to support patients and families in our care. This year, we also saw a 7% increase in average sponsorship, with nearly £200 raised per walker - a huge achievement that made this one of our most successful walks yet!

Running Towards 500: A Tribute to Al's Determination and the Power of Compassion

Al, a much-loved patient on our Inpatient Unit, had completed an extraordinary 480+ Parkruns, each 5K a testament to his passion for running and community. His goal was clear: to reach 500 runs. Sadly, as his health declined, it became apparent he wouldn't be able to complete them all on his own.

Determined not to let that dream go, Al's friends and the hospice team rallied together. With their support, he managed to complete several more runs in his wheelchair, bringing his total to an inspiring 492.

As Al's condition continued to deteriorate, IPU Sister Natalie and her team stepped in with a touching gesture. Eight hospice staff members each dedicated a Parkrun in his honour, helping him symbolically reach that incredible 500-run milestone. Natalie even contacted Salisbury Parkrun to see if these efforts could be officially recognised, and they graciously agreed.

Al's friends were deeply moved by the hospice team's compassion. One shared:

"I and Al's other friends are overflowing with goodwill and gratitude after seeing the work you do. Our time at the hospice made a terribly sad few weeks as happy and Al-like as it could possibly have been under the circumstances. There is certainly a Parkrun story to be told!"

We're incredibly grateful to everyone who made this possible, from staff and volunteers to the local Parkrun community. This story is a powerful reminder that even in the most difficult times, small acts of kindness and shared determination can make dreams come true.

Thank You to the Fabulous Funday Committee -Turning Love Into Legacy



Since 2013, a remarkable group of individuals has brought joy, community spirit, and extraordinary generosity to Salisbury all in the name of love, remembrance, and giving back. We are incredibly proud to shine a spotlight on the Fabulous Funday Committee, who have raised an outstanding £163,000 for Salisbury Hospice through the annual Fabulous Family Fun Day.

This much-loved event began as a deeply personal mission. In 2013, Greig Futcher launched the very first Football Fun Day following the heart-breaking loss of his wife, Lyn, who received compassionate and dedicated care from the Salisbury Hospice team during her final days. Left with three young sons, Greig was determined to give back. Together, this incredible team has now raised over £163,000, with this year's event alone bringing in almost £31,000 - a testament to their passion, dedication, and unwavering support for hospice care in our community.

"I wanted to give back after Lyn and our family were given such outstanding, phenomenal care – the nurses went above and beyond to ensure we were all coping in the best way we could," Greig shared.

That first year, Greig and his close circle of family and friends raised £668. From that small but powerful beginning, the Fabulous Family Fun Day has grown into a major annual event, powered by the tireless efforts of a truly fabulous committee: Spencer, Sarah, Sam, Claire, Jason, and Tamsin.

Their work has not gone unnoticed. In 2020, Greig was honoured as Charity Fundraiser of the Year at the Spire FM Local Hero Awards, a well-deserved recognition of the love, energy, and time he continues to pour into this cause. On behalf of everyone at Salisbury Hospice Charity, we extend our deepest thanks to all the Fabulous Committee Members and all the volunteers that have worked tirelessly on the day over many years. Your efforts have not only raised vital funds, but have also created an annual tradition that brings people together and keeps Lyn's legacy alive in the most meaningful way.

Join Our Hospice Driving Team Make a Meaningful Difference



We are currently looking for volunteers to join our Hospice Day Service driving team. As a hospice volunteer driver, you'll play a vital role in helping patients attend enriching sessions such as creative arts, gardening, and "living well" workshops. These visits not only support patients' wellbeing but also give families a much-needed break, knowing their loved ones are in safe hands.

The commitment is light but impactful: most volunteers drive once a week (10:30 drop-off and 13:30 pick-up) for a 12-week period often with the same patient each week, allowing real connections to form. We also welcome cover drivers to help during holidays or sickness.

We cover a wide area, and you can choose a local route or one slightly further afield. All passengers are able to get in and out of vehicles independently, although some may use walking aids or mobility equipment.

You'll be joining a small, friendly, and supportive team who find this role deeply rewarding. If you'd like to make a difference from the driver's seat, we'd love to hear from you.
